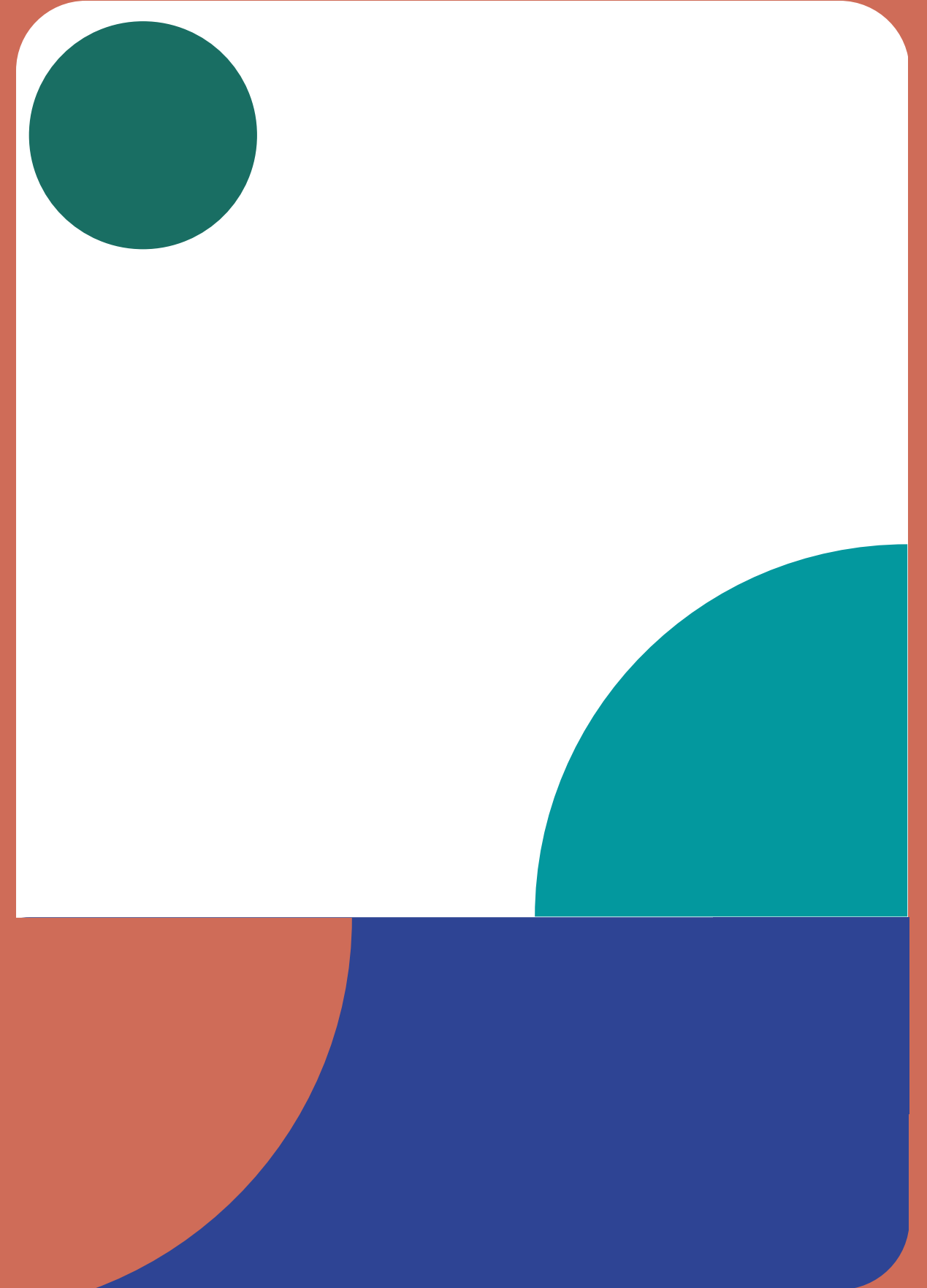
Here are some expectations of our Mentees:

- Attend planned socials created by your mentors



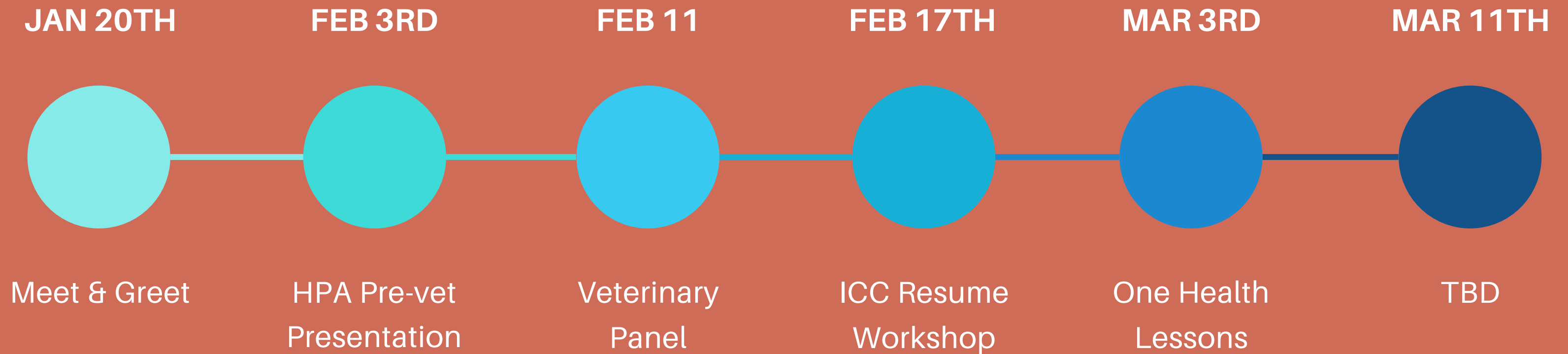
Expectations for Mentors:

- Hold at least one social with mentor pairings



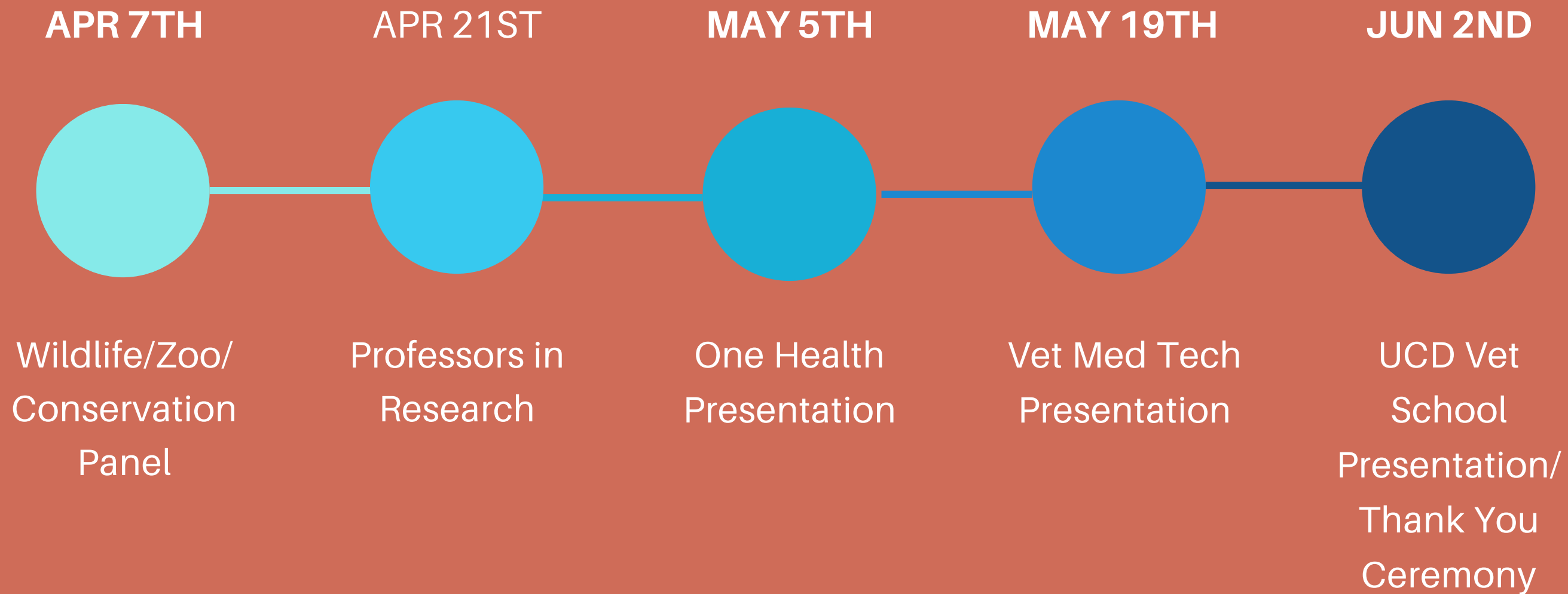
Planned Events (Winter Quarter)
